It's this influence from the mountains and sun conditions that makes Argentina's wines so unmistakable.



Day 02







Today is all yours filled with endless possibilities!

After breakfast, take the day to leisurely explore Buenos Aires on your own and visit some of the city's most iconic sights and museums. A few suggestions are listed below for your consideration:

Explore the culture of the northern area of Buenos Aires. *Recoleta* is an affluent area known for Paris-style townhouses, lavish former palaces, and posh boutiques. These classic neighborhoods of Recoleta are where the European aristocracy found refuge in Argentina, marking the city with its incomparable architecture and rich cultural heritage which gave it the nickname: The Paris of South America. A main attraction is *Recoleta Cemetery*, where national icons like Eva Perón rest in extravagant tombs. This cemetery is a masterpiece, containing thousands of works of art enriched by history. Don't forget to get a photo next to the symbol of the city, the *Flor Generica*.

Another option is to wander through the southern part of the city, stopping in bohemian San Telmo, overflowing with memories of the wealthy European families in its antique stores and markets. The old part of La Boca, originally inhabited by many Italian immigrants and home of Tango, is now one of the most visited places in Buenos Aires for its unique colorful architecture. The Teatro Colón is one of the few in the world that has its own workshops in which the sets, costumes (costumes, wigs and shoes) and special effects for the monumental staging are carried out in an integral way. Before the afternoon slips away, make a visit to the San Telmo market where you can stop for a bite of your favorite Argentinian food and eat like a local.

As evening approaches, meet up with the entire tour group for a welcome dinner. Feast on local specialties at a planned Argentine experience. Bob and Wendy Biale will be joining you this evening for dinner. They are excited to welcome you to the start of your South American cruise. Overnight again at the Alvear Icon Hotel.
